## Why JODI Gas?

•The need for more Transparency in the Gas Market.

## **Recent Changes in Gas Market**

- 1. Increasing **globalization** of the natural gas business. (Markets are influenced by changes in supply and demand globally, as well as locally.)
- 2. Greater potential for interconnections between regional markets.
- 3. The increase in **shale gas** sources has reduced imports of LNG in the US.
- 4. LNG producers now **focus on Asian region**. (Natural gas prices trading higher in Asia due to increased demand as a consequence of the Fukushima tragedy and linkage of natural gas prices with oil and products prices.)

## The Need for more Transparency

Producers, consumers and traders of gas need information on conditions
 globally.

 Market players in all regions have an interest in seeing an improvement in the quality of information to conduct their business efficiently.

Companies need information to mitigate financial risks to their activities.

## The need for a JODI gas Database

 Implementation of JODI-Gas will help reduce uncertainty, improve predictability and facilitate project planning.

 JODI-Gas offers a unique platform on which to build an information infrastructure, similar to oil with JODI-Oil.

2010: JODI-Gas supported at the 12th IEF Ministerial in Mexico.



 2012: JODI-Gas again received strong support from Energy Ministers at the 13th IEF Ministerial in Kuwait.



## Calls by G20 to Launch JODI-Gas

- **2009**: Heads of State at the **G20 Summit in Pittsburgh** (Sept 2009) asked to start work on JODI Gas similar to JODI Oil.
- 2011: A joint (OPEC-IEF-IEA) report to the G20 Cannes meeting in 2011, called for improvement in the quality of information to improve market transparency.
- 2011 & 2012: G20 Cannes Summit Declaration 2011, Mexico 2012 requested Joint Organizations Data Initiative (JODI) extension to natural gas.







## **Major Milestones Accomplished**


- 2009-Data Exercise started: JODI partner organizations conducted a gas data collection exercise to assess MC's abilities on a monthly basis since 2009.
- **2010 JODI-Gas Conferences**: discuss necessary conditions for establishing a monthly gas data collection mechanism at the global level:
  - The first Gas Data Transparency Conference was held in Moscow in 2010.
  - The second Gas Data Transparency Conference held in Doha, Qatar in 2012
  - The Third Gas Data Transparency Conference in Bali, Indonesia in 2013.
- 2013 Database Beta Testing: JODI-Gas Database opened for beta-Testing January 2013
- 2013 JODI-Gas Manual and Training Workshops:
  - JODI-Gas Manual Issued (February 2014)
  - 2 JODI-Gas Training workshops conducted: (KL, Oct 2013; Baku Feb 2014)
- **Countries Participations:** Currently, about 72 countries are participating in this initiative, accounting for about 85% of the global natural gas supply and gas demand.




